

Selection Policy Australian Titles

BOXERS

Boxing Queensland adhere to a policy of self selection wherein the winning of the State Titles is the determining factor in selection for National Titles. In all instances the winning boxer becomes the 1st nominee to the National Titles. Boxers must have weighed in / competed at the State Titles to be eligible for selection to National Titles; there is no allowance for illness or injury. Should no opponent be available at the Nationals in the boxers' weight class the boxer may move up or down one weight class provided this weight class, within the appropriate age limits, has been uncontested at the Queensland Titles and was not won by walkover.

Boxers winning by walkover are entitled to represent their state provided they are not novice boxers, in the event that a novice boxer has won a weight class by walkover the executive committee will determine if the said boxer competes at the Nationals considering the boxers age, weight, skills and competitors.

Should a boxer who has won the Queensland Titles withdraw from the National Titles a replacement boxer will be found if time permits. The replacement boxer is to be the silver medallist in the same weight class, if no silver medallist exists in this weight class the silver medallist from the weight class immediately below or above (providing boxer can demonstrate an ability to make weight) may be considered. The executive are responsible for this decision.

A boxer who has nominated as youth/elite male or female at the Queensland Titles can also be chosen as replacement boxer for an elite/youth boxer if he/she were the silver medallist or if he/she were the gold medallist but no opponent is available in the boxers' weight class at National Titles. The executive are responsible for this decision.

A boxer who has nominated as either youth or elite but who falls within the appropriate age limits to compete at either may only move categories if no other boxer is already competing in this category. Boxers should be careful to weigh in and compete in the category they wish to compete in at the National Titles.

In the event that Boxing Australia allows a number of additional entries the executive committee will choose the weight classes. If the gold medallist is clearly superior to all other competitors in his/her weight class within Boxing Queensland no 2nd entry will be permitted. This is not automatic and is at the discretion of the executive committee.

Selection Policy Australian Titles

COACHES

Boxing Queensland adhere to a policy of self selection wherein the coaches are chosen dependent on the number of boxers each coach has competing at the National Titles. Where this number is equal the coaches will be chosen by random selection criteria.

Boxing Queensland in all instances encourages all coaches to attend the National Titles and allows coaches to corner their own boxer/s in conjunction with a State Coach.

Boxing Queensland assist coaches by subsidising the cost of attendance at the National Titles, however this is only available to those selected as a State Coach.

Previous service as a State Coach has no bearing on selection.

Selection Policy for Selection Trials

BOXERS

Where 2 boxers are permitted in each weight division; In this instance the boxer who has won the last State Title is determined to hold the number 1 spot in the weight division in which they contested the National Titles. This boxer, providing they still compete in the same weight division becomes Boxing Queensland's 1st selection. Selection for the 2nd spot will be determined by competition within Queensland.

Where 1 boxer is permitted in each weight division; Boxers will be chosen by competition within Queensland, the winner of the State Titles will be seeded. The winning boxer will attend the National Selection Trials.

Should no competitor be available within Queensland for State Selection Trials Box Offs the boxer must weigh in at their nominated weight at a tournament as chosen by the executive. Boxers not weighing in at their nominated weight will not be considered for competition regardless of previous experience.

Boxers must make themselves available for State Selection Trials Box Offs to be allowed a chance at competing nationally for the Selection Trials. There is no allowance for illness or injury. Should no opponent be available at the Selection Trials in the boxers' weight class the boxer may move up or down one weight class provided this weight class, within the appropriate age limits, has been uncontested at the State Selection Trials Box Offs and was not won by walkover.

Boxers winning by walkover are entitled to represent their state provided they are not novice boxers, in the event that a novice boxer has won a weight class by walkover the selection committee will determine if the said boxer competes at the National Selection Trials considering the boxers age, weight, skills and competition.

Should a boxer who has won the Queensland Titles withdraw from the National Selection Trials a replacement boxer will be found if time permits. The replacement boxer is to be the runner-up in the same weight class, if no runner-up exists in this weight class the runner-up from the weight class immediately below or above (providing boxer can demonstrate an ability to make weight) may be considered. The executive are responsible for this decision.

A boxer who has nominated as youth/elite male or female at the State Selection Trials Box Offs can also be chosen as replacement boxer for an elite/youth boxer if he/she were the runner-up or if he/she were the winner at the Box Offs but no opponent is available in the boxers' weight class at the National Selection Trials. The executive will be responsible for this decision.

A boxer who has nominated as either youth or elite but who falls within the appropriate age limits to compete at either may only move categories if no other boxer is already competing in this category. Boxers should be careful to weigh in and compete in the category they wish to compete in at the National Selection Trials.

Selection Policy for Selection Trials

COACHES

Boxing Queensland adhere to a policy of self selection wherein the coaches are chosen dependent on the number of boxers each coach has competing at the National Selection Trials. Where this number is equal the coaches will be chosen by random selection criteria.

Boxing Queensland in all instances encourages all coaches to attend the National Selection Trials and allows coaches to corner their own boxer/s in conjunction with a State Coach.

Boxing Queensland assist coaches by subsidising the cost of attendance at the National Selection Trials, however this is only available to those selected as a State Coach.

Previous service as a State Coach has no bearing on selection.

Selection Policy for Queensland Select Teams

BOXERS / COACHES

Boxing Queensland endeavour to take a least one team overseas each year, this is to further enhance the skills and experience of both our boxers and coaches. In these cases Boxing Queensland is often limited by the needs and criteria of the host nation who provide Boxing Queensland with the numbers, experience and ages needed and in these cases the needs of the host nation/club will supersede our own criteria.

Where possible, notwithstanding the needs of the host, the boxer who won the last State Title, providing they still compete in the same weight division, becomes Boxing Queensland's 1st selection, these boxers are open to challenge. The name and weight category of boxers will be listed on the web page and it is the responsibility of the challenger to contact Boxing Queensland to nominate for challenge bouts.

While these trips are subsidised a substantial portion of the cost must be borne by each competitor it is imperative that persons do not nominate unless they are in a position to pay for the trip. Cost of the trip can be provided to you by the secretary of Boxing Queensland.

Coaches/managers will be subsidised at the same rate as the boxers, coaches will be selected by the number of competitors and experience.

Boxing Queensland if possible will take officials so they can also gain experience, subsidy as per boxers and coaches.

The decision of the executive is final.
